Your child's home group teacher has worked tirelessly to ensure that they remain connected to school and that they are meeting the following recommendations from Catholic Education Melbourne:

For learners in **Years Prep to 2**, the school will provide a daily learning program as follows:

- English (45-60 minutes)
- Mathematics (30-45 minutes)
- Additional learning areas Religious Education, Inquiry, Italian, Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Physical Education (30-45 minutes)

For students in **Years 3 to 6**, the school will provide a daily learning program allocated as follows:

- English (45-60 minutes)
- Mathematics (30-45 minutes)
- Physical activities (30 minutes) Physical Education
- Additional learning areas Religious Education, Inquiry, Italian, Visual Arts, Performing Arts (90 minutes)

Please be aware that your child's home group teacher will also provide feedback on two learning task samples per learner per week via Seesaw, as normal.

During this difficult time, we must all take care to support one another.
